








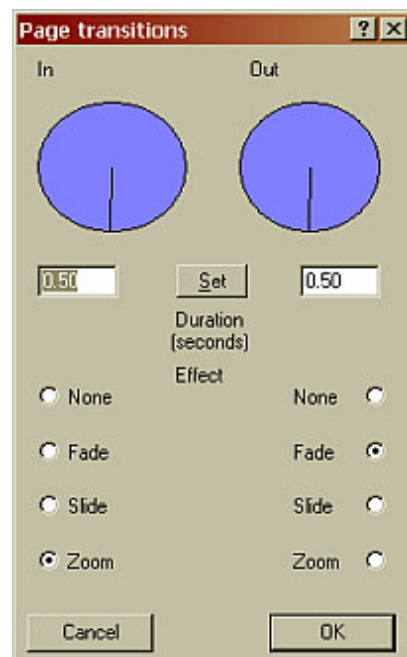


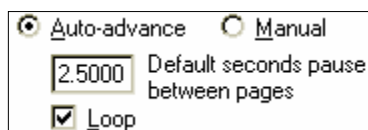
How to create a slideshow using Powerbullet


1. Collect your images for your slideshow. Try to select images that have similar dimensions, e.g.: this image at right is 118 X 180 pixels. Open Powerbullet and name your project (if you don't name your project now, it will be called UNTITLED which you can change later if you Save As).
2. Use the Layout Dimensions button  (or use the drop-down menu for Draw settings to select the Layout dimensions) to set a size that matches your image dimensions.
3. Go to Insert on the menu bar and click Image. Browse for your image folder and click the image you want to insert. When the image appears in the layout, you may need to click and drag it to center it in the box. Once it's centered, click the lock button   to keep it from moving around.
4. Now use the Transition button  (or select it under Insert) to select how the page changes. Select a transition for the page entrance (In) and exit (Out). And enter a time in seconds, like 0.50 (for half a second) and click the Set button (Important!). Then click OK.
5. Now add pages  and repeat steps 3 & 4 until all your images are added to your slideshow.
6. Use the arrows   to cycle through your pages and use the shift buttons   to change the order of pages if needed.





When you have added all the images for your show, save your work!

Under File (on the menu bar) is where you find the Export settings. There are a lot of options, but the most important ones are for Auto-advance, how long you want each image to be displayed (remember that we have .5 second for the transition In and .5 for Out, so the 2.5 second pause will display each image (page) for 1.5 seconds. We also want our show to loop, so it will cycle through all the pages as long as the web page is displayed.



When that's done, click the Export button  to export your slideshow into a Shockwave file. All of your files for the project will be in a folder with the same name as your

project. The actual slideshow file will have the extension swf; this is the file you add to or <embed> into your website.

You can also add hypertext links to your pages  which can link to a different web page, and you can preview each page  (this is helpful) before you export the whole project.
